For instance, there is a lower blood alcohol level in drunk driving cases and new definitions in stalking and assault cases. One of the most notable changes is the creation of a new special court-martial forum composed of a military judge alone and new procedures for selecting members in other special and general courtsmartial. We will be updating our panel selection page soon to reflect those changes. There are changes to plea bargaining and sentencing. The manual creates a binding pretrial agreement and a procedure for the government to appeal sentences that they consider unreasonable. The manual broadens the powers of military judge's to issue subpoenas prior to referral of charges.
